FROM YOUR RECTOR... by the Reverend Sean Ferrell



It's amazing to think that here at the beginning of March I am already having to write about Holy Week

and Easter. With an early Lent comes an early Easter. It's just around the corner. In just about three weeks our Holy Week and Easter celebrations will begin again.

The Latin word "Triduum" (*pronounced "trid-you-um"*) means a period of three days. While the word cannot be found in the Book of Common Prayer, it is used frequently by Episcopalians and refers to the period beginning with sundown on

Maundy Thursday and extending until sundown on Easter Day. Triduum corresponds with the most ancient celebrations of Easter and includes our celebrations of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, the Great Vigil of Easter, and services on Easter Day, not seeing them as divided celebrations, but one seamless liturgy enacted on these three days.

Liturgist Kenneth Stevenson calls the piety of the of the rites of Holy Week "rememorative": they remember the historical events of the passion. They don't imitate them like a passion play, but they are remembered symbolically so that we may enter into them. And that is my hope, that we will indeed enter into the Triduum - *the three day liturgy of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Great Vigil of Easter* - as a parish family, in spite of the fact that many of our local schools have scheduled Spring Break that week.

This year we are working hard to make these services deep, symbolically rich, and full of meaning. Maundy Thursday (March 20 at 7 p.m.) begins our celebration. This year, our plan is to center the liturgy on the servanthood of Jesus in his washing of his disciples' feet. As a part of this service there will be foot washing. NOTE: If you come to this service you DO NOT have to participate in the footwashing. No one is compelled. You may if you wish. Footwashing can function either as an parable to be watched, or as one that can be participated in actively. I find the practice helpful, humbling, spiritually rich, and rememorative, even though it stretches many people's comfort zone. As always, the service will include the celebration of the Holy Eucharist and the Stripping of the Altar.

Our Good Friday service will again follow the Proper Liturgy for Good Friday from the 1979 Book of Common Prayer. It meditates on the Passion from John's Gospel. We will again hear the Passion Gospel sung at St. Luke's. Our choir will also be singing the three traditional Good Friday anthems on this day. The Prayer Book recommends that a wooden cross be brought in as a part of the service. Jim Bevis has created a new Good Friday Cross for us, made from timbers salvaged from our tornado destroyed nave. Each of these practices are quite ancient and are a magnificent way to re-tell our Christian story.

In this day and age, I don't need to tell you that more and more people are precluded from participating in Good Friday services simply because their employer or school doesn't give the day off. Therefore our parish's major celebration of the events of Good Friday will be at 7 p.m. on March 21, and the service itself will last a little over an hour. On Good Friday at Noon, we will offer a quiet devotion called the Stations of the Cross or the Way of the Cross, which remembers Christ's last steps on the earth. Many find this little devotion powerful, and if you find yourself longing for service at Noon, I encourage you to participate.

The Great Vigil of Easter (Saturday, March 22, at 7 p.m.) is the first service of Easter. Like Christmas Eve it is our first liturgical remembrance of the event. It begins with the lighting of the new Paschal fire and a candle-lit vigil of readings. *(In our case, we'll begin with three readings.)* Then we will move to the font and renew our Baptismal Covenant. We normally perform Baptisms at this service. *(Note: If you are aware of someone we need to baptize, please contact the church office.)* Then the new Easter is proclaimed, the lights come up and we celebrate Eucharist together. By nature the Great Vigil is a service that takes about an hour and a half. Like Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, we will provide childcare at this important service.

Easter is early this year, and for that I am thankful. Kiezha and I will be keeping our own vigil. As you know, we will be welcoming a new addition to our little family. Kiezha is due on April 14 and it is wonderful to have three weeks between Easter and our due date. I will take 2-3 weeks of paternity leave after his arrival, and graciously, the Reverend Canon Rene Somodevilla, Canon to the Ordinary in the Diocese of West Tennessee has agreed to block out his calendar for the month of April and will cover any of the dates I am away.

In the mean time, I pray that you are able to join us as we re-engage our celebration of these important holy days.

CHECK SENT TO CASA

The second endowment grant has been issued to CASA from the Meredith Outreach Endowment. The staff, volunteers and board of Directors of Madison County CASA have expressed their gratitude to St. Luke's that they were chosen as the first recipients of the Meredith Endowment Grant.

CASA stands for Court Appointed Special Advocates. These advocates work to represent the children in cases of abuse and neglect, meeting with all parties involved, investigating each case and speaking on behalf of the children.

Amy Jones, the Executive Director of Madison County CASA has given us a progress report that reflects how these funds are being used. As a direct result of the grant, they have added an Advocate Supervisor to the staff; six new advocates have been trained and are serving children, working on behalf of ten abused and neglected children in Madison County; and ten more are currently in training to begin serving very soon.

Thanks to our Endowment Committee for their dedication, hard work and being good stewards of the Hal & Beth Meredith Endowment.

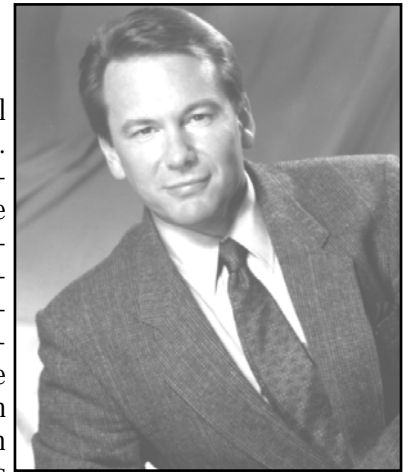

SUNDAY CONCERT SERIES

The next concert will feature Randal Rushing, acclaimed Memphis tenor. Dr. Rushing is Professor of Voice and Associate Director for Student Services at the Rudi E. Scheidt School of Music, University of Memphis. He has performed extensively throughout Germany, Switzerland, Central America, and the Czech Republic, as well as the United States. He recently made his Lincoln Center debut in Handel's Messiah. He made his debut in 2001 with the illustrious St. Cecilia Chorus at Carnegie Hall and has made three return appearances there. In addition to singing with the Memphis Symphony, he has performed with the Chicago Symphony and the Shreveport Symphony. A recipient of the Rotary International Foundation Scholarship, he studied at the Staatliche Hochschule für Musik Rheinland in Köln, Germany. Upon completion, he had opera engagements throughout Europe and made regular appearances on German and Swiss television.

In addition to his University responsibilities, Dr. Rushing leads the music at the Church of the Annunciation in Cordova. The concert on March 2 will be a potpourri of favorites from stage and opera. Concert time is 4:00 pm, and a reception will follow. Childcare will be provided. Please invite your friends to hear this outstanding performer.

THE UNITED THANK OFFERING

The United Thank Offering is a ministry of the Episcopal Church and a long standing tradition at St. Luke's that provides a way for men, women and children to give daily thanks to God with a sense of gratitude. It is most easily identifiable by the small blue offering box distributed to members of the parish. Essentially, it is a discipline that begins at home by placing coins or bills in the "Blue Box." The coins or bills placed in the box are designed to be the sum of our daily thanks for the blessing in our everyday lives—for good weather, happy times, job opportunity, and unexpected visits—there are so many things for which we can be thankful. It is the outward and visible sign of the spiritual practice of thanksgiving for all of our many blessings.

At the end of the designated period, you are asked to bring the amount of your daily thanksgiving for the ingathering. When the date of the Ingathering approaches, you will receive a blue envelope in the Parish Life. *Empty the contents of the box into the envelope and bring it to church on the appointed day or to the church office that week. Continue using your blue box for the next ingathering.* The total amount collected will be sent to the Episcopal Church Women, where it is combined with the offerings of hundreds of thousands of other Episcopalians to become the United Thank Offering.

Again this year, St. Luke's has selected to use the United Thank Offering during the season of Lent. It is our hope that you will make it a part or your own personal Lenten discipline. At the beginning of Lent (on Ash Wednesday, February 6 and on the first Sunday of Lent, February 10) the blue boxes will be available in the Narthex and in the Commons for anyone wishing to participate (adults and children alike!) Our Spring Ingathering will occur on Palm Sunday, Sunday, March 16, and you will find your blue envelope in your Palm Sunday service bulletin.

LENTEN PROGRAM AND DINNERS

The Lenten Suppers continue with great success. The February 13th dinner was provided by the Vestry prepared with Donna Boren's kitchen expertise. 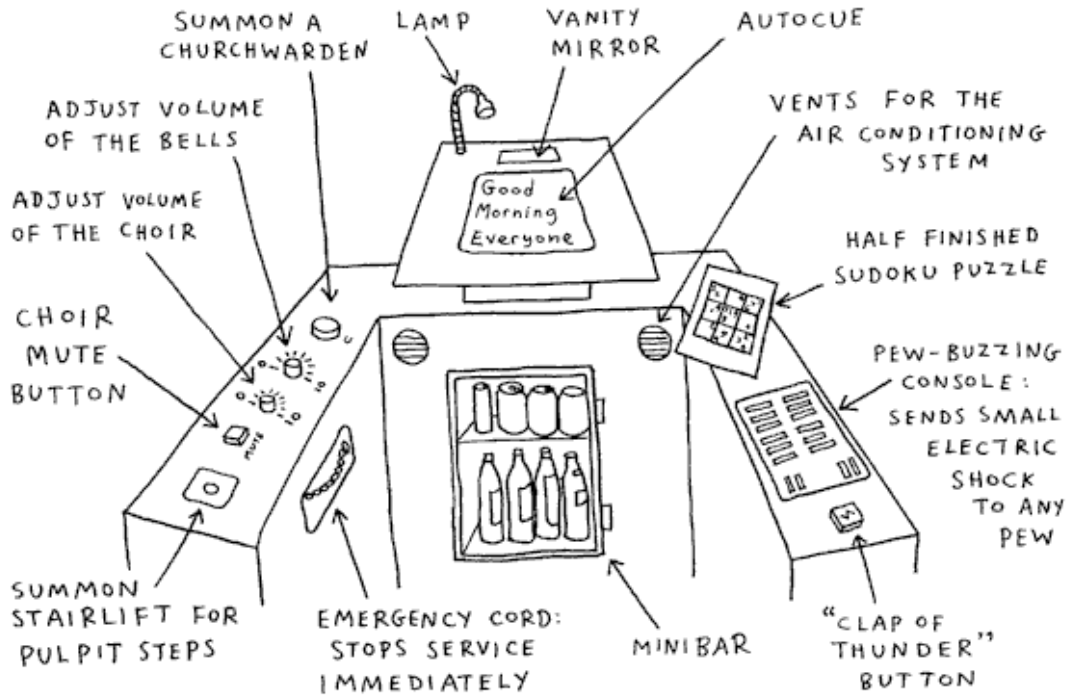
