FROM YOUR RECTOR... *by the Reverend Sean Ferrell*

I am excited to share with you that our bishop, the Right Reverend Don E. Johnson, will be with us at Saint



Luke's twice in the near future. Kiezha and I are pleased to announce that he will baptize our new son Declan at the 10:30 am service on Sunday, August 10. Following that service, we are extending a parish-wide invitation to join us at our new home for a celebration. Our new address is 136 Westwood Avenue, less than a mile from Saint Luke's. We hope that you will join us for the service and

the celebration. (Oh, and if August 10 happens to be a rainy Sunday, our venue will be the Parish Hall instead of our home.)

One of the questions that people occasionally ask is why I have not baptized my own children. I believe that clergy families need clergy too. The Bishop is the chief pastor of the diocese and pastor to clergy and clergy families, and so we believe it important for him to be a part of this occasion. As you may have heard me say, "Even clergy need clergy."

Bishop Johnson will also be joining us on Sunday, November 16, 2008 for our annual parish visit. That means it is time to begin our confirmation/inquirers classes again. These gatherings are for people who are interested in learning more about the Episcopal Church, and also for



those who are preparing to join Saint Luke's. The end result is that one may elect at the end of the process to receive the sacramental rite of Confirmation at the end of the process, or be Received, or Re-affirm your Baptismal vows. If you've been Confirmed in another denomination, often you can be Received as a member of the Episcopal Church. Further, if you have been Confirmed in the Episcopal Church previously, you are always welcome to join us for classes, and on the day the Bishop visits, he will recognize that you have Re-affirmed your baptismal vows. (When I worked as a college chaplain I had many college students who Re-affirmed their baptismal vows when they had been Confirmed young and wanted to revisit the Confirmation process). The other option, of course, is to join us for classes alone.

We generally like for youth confirmands to be at least twelve years old, because the Sacrament of Confirmation is really about making an adult pro-

RIFA sends food home each weekend for almost 300 needy children through the snack-back-pack program. The community kitchen is currently serving an average of 150 people per day. RIFA also passes out nearly 200 sacks of food per month. These numbers will increase with the weak economy. We are trying to do our part to help feed the hungry in Madison County by helping to provide needed items to RIFA.

These items can be purchased at Wal-Mart or Kroger for a small cost—all items are less than \$10 each, some less than \$5. Please remember the needy when you are filling your shopping cart. This is a small way that everyone can help and individual contributions add up to a big help to those less fortunate in our community.

Please bring your items to the church and place them on the table outside the Library or in the red wagons in the Narthex. Items will be collected on the second Sunday of each month. If you have any questions, please contact the parish office at 424-0556.

fession of faith. According to our Catechism in the Book of Common Prayer, "Confirmation is the rite in which we express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through the prayer and laying on of hands by a bishop." I do not call upon participants to memorize the Nicene Creed (or anything else for that matter), so consider joining us. Classes will begin September 14 in the library during our Christian Education hour at 9:15 a.m. If you are interested in participating, please do let me know, and plan to be with us on the 14th.

The Prayer Book recommends five times during the year for Baptisms, and one of those times is when the bishop is visiting. (The others happen to be The First Sunday after the Epiphany – the Baptism of Jesus, The Great Vigil of Easter, Pentecost, and All Saints' Day.) Our Catechism in the Prayer Book says that Baptism is the sacrament by which God adopts us as his children and makes us members of Christ's Body, the Church, and inheritors of the kingdom of God. If you have a little one (or a big one, or yourself, for that matter) to be Baptized, you then have three available options in the not too distant future. You would be welcome to talk with me about August 10 (when Declan will be baptized - we're happy to share the day with you), or All Saints' Sunday (November 2), or November 16 (at the bishop's visit). Any of those dates would be especially appropriate.

It is beginning to look like our Fall will be filled with celebrations. I invite you to come and take part!

NEW FOYER GROUPS BEGIN AUGUST

New Foyer Groups will begin in August and run through November, 2008. Foyer Groups are an easy and enjoyable way for parishioners to get to know one another - especially newcomers and folks who go to different services-- in an informal social setting.

Each Foyer Group is usually composed of eight adults: three couples and two single people. Once each month, over a four-month period, group members meet at one another's homes (or sometimes at a restaurant) for a simple dinner, to get to know



each other. Group members take turns hosting the dinners (usually held on a Sunday or Saturday evening) from about 6-8 or 7-9 p.m. At the end of each period, new groups are formed, to enable members to get to meet other people from Saint Luke's. Members are automatically assigned to a new group at the appropriate time, unless they no longer want to participate.

Each Foyer Group has a convener/conveners, who contact the group members and set up the dates for dinners. SAFEGUARDING GOD'S CHILDREN

The topic of taking every possible step to keep children safe from sexual abuse, particularly in church setting, is a high priority in the Episcopal Church and in this Diocese. Therefore there are several training sessions held throughout the year in an effort to protect our children and our church. Those required to take this training, per the Diocesan guidelines, are all paid staff members, all parishioners working directly with children and all vestry members who are involved in leadership and policy making within the church.

The next session to be held at St. Luke's will be September 11, 2008 from 6 p.m. - 8 p.m. This is an important issue and it is required for many parishioners. If you have not had this training in the last 3 years and you are one of the people require to, please mark your calendars and plan to be in attendance. This training is also available to parents if you want to take extra steps to safeguard your children by knowing signs of abuse or signs of potential predators from any setting your child might be in.

If you find that this date simply doesn't work for you, there are other sessions available in Memphis. You may call the parish office for a list of those dates and locations.

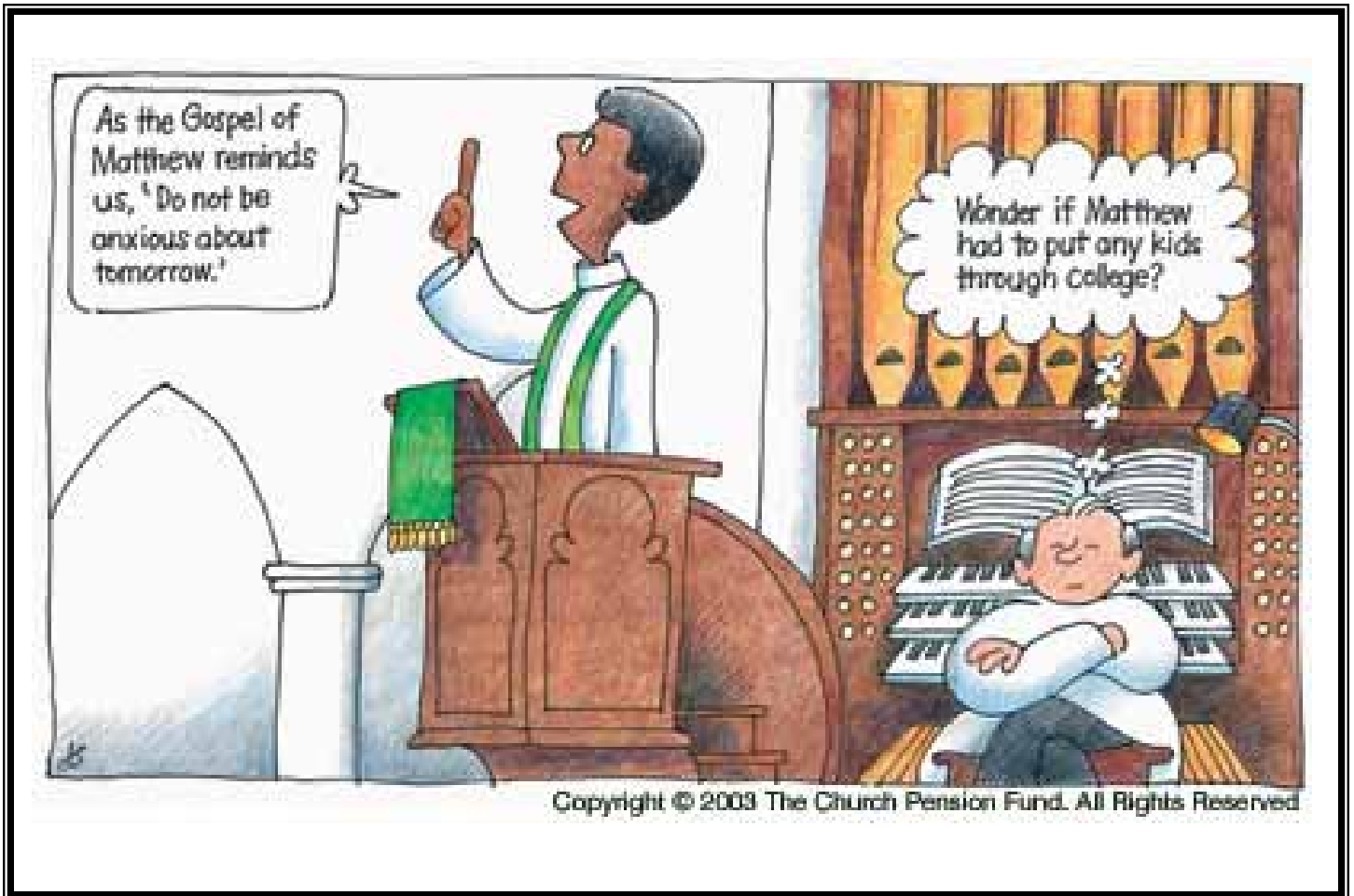
